Minden is in the process of re-juvenating its economic development presence with the creation of the Minden Development Corporation and the launching of the Discover Minden campaign. This will be a 501(c)4 corporation that is funded primarily through a contribution from the City of Minden and from private membership.



This successful partnership provides an effective and efficient means of the common goal of creating jobs and investment opportunities, which ultimately result in higher quality of life for the citizens of Minden.

Firms with retail sales tax permits in Minden reported 2023 net taxable retail sales of \$31,240,027, while Kearney County reported retail sales of \$36,008,061.



Minden is the county seat and is located in the center of Kearney County.

Nebraska Highway's 6 and 34 run east-west, Highway 10 runs north-south, and Highway 74 runs east. Minden is 25 miles from Kearney, 30 miles from Hastings, and 22 miles from Holdrege.


Trucklines

Minden is governed by a Mayor-Council form of government. It has one City Administrator and a City Clerk. Kearney County has five townships and is governed by seven Board of Commissioners.

Minden has 34 miles of streets; 83 percent of the streets are hard-surfaced. 30 percent of the streets are concrete, 17 percent are gravel, and 50 percent are asphalt.

Utilities

Nebraska Highlights

Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) is the state's largest electric generating utility in terms of chartered territory, which includes all or parts of 86 of Nebraska's 93 counties. NPPD relies upon nine major generating facilities, more than 5,000 miles of high-voltage power lines, approximately 260 substations, and thousands more miles of distribution lines. Because the system is interconnected to electrical grids in other states, NPPD works with regional utilities and industry entities to ensure power is delivered safely and dependably to Nebraskans.

Energy costs are often a considerable

part of any business' operational budget. These costs can vary greatly between states, but in Nebraska (the only state in the nation where all electric utilities are publicly owned) electric costs are passed to consumers at low, cost-of-service rates. As a result, the state offers industrial rates well below the national average. Nebraska electric utilities achieve low rates, in part, because they draw from a balanced and efficient "mix" of generation resources.

Electricity

Minden is provided electric service by the City of Minden, which is a wholesale power customer of Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD).

NPPD's renewable resources play a central role in a strong carbon-free footprint. In addition to a power purchase agreement with seven of the state's wind farms, NPPD owns and operates the largest public power wind facility in the state near Ainsworth. NPPD has three hydropower facilities and contracts for generation from three other hydropower facilities. Community solar is available in seven communities, with more on the way. In 2021, NPPD's Cooper Nuclear Station contributed to an energy portfolio that was more than 56 percent carbon-free.




and price. A gas-producing state, Nebraska is close and well-connected by pipeline to the major gas fields of the central and southern plains.

Water & Sewerage

The municipal water system in Minden has a combined pumping capacity of 1,300 gallons per minute, and overhead storage capacity of 750,000 gallons per minute and underground storage capacity of 1,000,000 gallons per minute, with a maximus capacity of 1,800,000.

Minden has a municipal sanitary sewerage system, a storm sewer system, and a Sequencing Batch Reactor treatment plant with a capacity of .730/ MGD.

Agriculture

In 2023 Nebraska ranked first among the states in beef and beef product exports; third in corn exports and grain production. Nebraska's farms and ranches utilized 44 million acres or 89 percent of the state's total land area. Cash receipts from farm markets in 2022 contributed more than \$31.6 billion to the state's economy. Of that 52 percent originated from livestock and 48 percent from crops.

The Ogallala Aquifer underlies 174,000 square miles in parts of eight states. The Ogallala Aquifer within Nebraska contains approximately 65 percent of the water storage in the entire aquifer. With the implementation of more efficient irrigation systems and other water management measures, the Ogallala Aquifer will remain a valuable resource in Nebraska.



The Ogallala Aquifer, stretches through parts of eight states, but its most abundant water resource is located in nearly two-thirds of Nebraska. This groundwater availability has been essential to the success of agriculture in the state.

Surface Water

Nebraska's surface water resources are surprisingly extensive, including approximately 18,000 miles of continuously flowing rivers and streams and about 430 square miles of lakes.

Surface water is predominantly used by grazing livestock as its source drinking water.

Groundwater

Center pivot irrigation is the most common method of providing water to row crops in the state, and as a result, four of the largest manufacturers of center pivot systems in the world are located in Nebraska. Nebraska has more than 100,000 registered irrigation wells.


Climate

Nebraska has a continental climate. with hot summers and cold winters. Temperatures are highly variable from season to season and year to year.


Precipitation is also variable and ranges from an annual average of 15-20 inches in the west to 30-35 inches in southeast Nebraska.

The growing season in Nebraska fluctuates in length, but on average it ranges from 120 days in the extreme northwest to 170 days in the southeast.


