

Transportation

Location / Highways

Cozad is located in central Dawson County, approximately 15 miles west of Lexington, the county seat, and 15 miles east of Gothenburg. Nebraska Highway 21 runs through town from north to south and Nebraska Highway 30 runs east to west. Cozad is 50 miles east of North Platte, 50 miles west of Kearney, 179 miles west of Lincoln and 233 miles west of Omaha.

Air

The Cozad Municipal Airport has a 5,800 foot paved and lighted runway and a 3,000 foot grass runway. The local airport provides short and long term hangers, self-serve fuel, courtesy vehicles, free tie down, no ramp fees and free wifi.

Economic Development

The Cozad Development Corporation (CDC) is a non-profit economic development organization for the City of Cozad. Economic development is funded through a half cent sales tax approved by the voters of the city. Cozad Development owns approximately 150 shovel-ready acres and four buildings ripe for redevelopment. The price of the available property is \$30,000 per acre. For more information on available sites and buildings go to **sites.nppd.com.**

Cozad happens to be located in a designated Opportunity Zone, a New Market Tax Credit approved area. In addition, local Tax Increment Financing is a widely accepted development tool and the City of Cozad has a sizable


loan fund to support new and existing businesses. The entire city of Cozad has been set up as a PACE district.

Priority areas of CDC include: business retention, expansion, recruitment, and succession; housing and community development; and tourism. They offer many competitive incentive programs.

Firms with retail sales tax permits in Cozad reported 2023 net taxable retail sales of \$59,939,940 while Dawson County reported retail sales of \$291,795,094.




Average Annual Unemployment Insurance Contribution per Employee, 2021

Local Government

Cozad is governed by a Mayor-Council form of government and the City Administrator and City Clerk. The public elects members to four-year terms.

Dawson County has 20 precincts and eight townships. The county is governed by five County Board of Commissioners.

Streets

The city has 35 miles of streets; 95 percent of the streets are hard-surfaced; 90 percent of the streets have curbs; and 80 percent have sidewalks.

Fire Protection

Fire protection is provided to the city by a 32 member volunteer fire department. Cozad Volunteer Fire Department has one fire station and 218 fire hydrants.

Law Enforcement

The Cozad Police Department provides law enforcement in the community. The department has eight full-time police officers and six support personnel.


Utilities

Nebraska Highlights

Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) is the state's largest electric generating utility in terms of chartered territory, which includes all or parts of 84 of Nebraska's 93 counties. NPPD relies upon nine major generating facilities, more than 5,000 miles of high-voltage power lines, approximately 260 substations, and thousands more miles of distribution lines. Because the system is interconnected to electrical grids in other states, NPPD works with regional utilities and industry entities to ensure power is delivered safely and dependably to Nebraskans.

Energy costs are often a considerable part of any business' operational budget. These costs can vary greatly between states, but in Nebraska (the only state in the nation where all electric utilities are publicly owned) electric costs are passed to consumers at low, cost-of-service rates. As a result, the state offers industrial rates well below the national average. Nebraska electric utilities achieve low rates, in part, because they draw from a balanced and efficient "mix" of generation resources.


Nebraska Tax Incentives

Electricity

The electric 34.500 volt subtransmission facilities serving Cozad are owned and operated by The Board of Public Works, a wholesale power customer of Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD). The primary subtransmission service is from the Cozad 115.000/69.000/34.500 volt Substation with total subtransmission transformer capacity at 34,500 volts of 28,000 KVA. The City of Cozad provides power to Cozad from 4.160 volt, 2.400 volt and 480 volt distribution systems which are connected to six (6) 34,500 volt subtransmission substations. The City of Cozad's 34,500 volt subtransmission system is looped with two lines feeding the city and connected to NPPD's statewide 115,000 volt transmission electric grid.

Water & Sewerage

The municipal water system in Cozad is supplied by six wells, which have an average depth of 100-300 feet. The system, serving the entire city, has a combined pumping capacity of 6,875 gallons per minute and an overhead storage capacity of 500,000 gallons. The system has a

maximum capacity of 9,900,000 gallons per day.

The city has a municipal sanitary sewerage system and a storm sewer system. The sequencing batch reactor treatment plant has a daily capacity of 1,000,000 gallons.

Library

Wilson Public Library offers over 30,000 items for loan, including books, dvds, cake pans, puppets, and audiobooks. Digital audio and e-books are available through Overdrive and Libby apps. Free wifi, over 15 public computer stations or laptops to use, and many services are available such as fax, print, copy, and lamination for a nominal cost. The library is known for its programming for all ages. Visit wilsonpubliclibrary.org, or check out their Facebook page. Genealogy services and microfilm of newspapers back to the 1800s are available along with a variety of free research databases. The library has county and area newspapers as well as magazines to look at in a comfortable environment, or use one of several public rooms for different sizes of meetings. Wilson Public Library is also a destination, as there are beautiful sculptures outside the building and a unique art collection inside.

Recreation

There are seven parks in Cozad covering 38 acres. Muny Park is equipped with a baseball field and three soccer fields, horseshoe and volleyball courts, frisbee golf, playground equipment, restrooms, a picnic shelter and outdoor grills. The park also has a municipal Olympic-sized swimming pool and a hard-surfaced exercise trail. Camping sites with water, sewer, and 30–50-amp electrical service hookups are available in Muny Park.

Centennial Park is equipped with a picnic shelter and restrooms, playground equipment and a splash pad.

Frenchy Park is equipped with playground equipment, an outdoor basketball court, picnic tables, public restrooms and an outdoor grill.

Sportsman Field has playground equipment, public restrooms, tennis

courts, and a Little League ballfield. Additional Little League baseball and softball fields can be found at Stuckey Park. Bellamy Park also has softball and baseball fields.

Midway Lake is south of town and has 333 acres and is 10 miles long. Excellent fishing and scenic boating can be found all over the lake.

Agriculture

In 2021, Nebraska ranked first among the states in commercial cattle slaughter and popcorn production; second in beef and veal exports and commercial red meat production; third in corn exports and cash receipts from all farm commodities.

The **Ogallala Aquifer** underlies 174,000 square miles in parts of eight states. The Ogallala Aquifer within Nebraska contains approximately 65 percent of the water storage in the entire aquifer. With the implementation of more efficient irrigation systems and other water management measures the Ogallala Aquifer will remain a valuable resource in Nebraska.

Nebraska's Natural Resource Districts (NRDs) have responsibility for managing groundwater resources. The Nebraska Department of Natural Resources maintains responsibility for administration of surface water rights. In locations where groundwater and surface water are connected, the responsibility is shared among the NRDs and the state for achieving a sustainable balance between water supplies and water use.



Groundwater

One of Nebraska's most vital natural resources is its massive supply of groundwater. The High Plains Aquifer, also commonly referred to as the Ogallala Aquifer, stretches through parts of eight states, but its most abundant water resource is located in nearly two-thirds of Nebraska. This groundwater availability has been essential to the success of agriculture in the state.

Center pivot irrigation is the most common method of providing water to row crops in the state, and as a result,

four of the largest manufacturers of center pivot systems in the world are located in Nebraska. Nebraska has more than 100,000 registered irrigation wells.

With the implementation of more efficient irrigation systems and other water management measures, the Ogallala Aquifer will remain a valuable resource in Nebraska. An accessible water supply also is vital to Nebraska's livestock and dairy production.

Climate


Nebraska has a continental climate, with hot summers and cold winters. Temperatures are highly variable from season to season and year to year.

Precipitation is also variable and ranges from an annual average of 15-20 inches in the west to 30-35 inches in southeast Nebraska.

The growing season in Nebraska fluctuates in length, but on average it ranges from 120 days in the extreme northwest to 170 days in the southeast.
